Campos de Ensueños Exhibition Travels to Channing Peake Gallery

Santa Barbara. CA - April 5, 2016

The Santa Barbara County Arts Commission is pleased to present Campos de Ensueños, a photography exhibition featuring artists Ricardo Palavecino and Antonio Arredondo Juarez. Organized by Craig Rosen of the Ventura County Arts Council in collaboration with the Mixteco Indigenous Community Organizing Project (MICOP), Campos de Ensueños focuses on field workers and the California Mixteco community.

A reception for the artists will be held in Channing Peake Gallery during the 1st Thursday in May, on May 5 from 5-7 p.m. The reception will feature Oaxacan food, music, dancing and presentations by the artists as well as the Teguio Youth Group (MICOP's initiative to develop the leadership skills of indigenous Mexican youth). The exhibition will be on view through August 26, 2016.

Born in Chile, photographer Ricardo Palavecino has also worked as a videographer and cinematographer for over thirty years. Campos de Ensueños includes Palavecino's

portraits of and personal statements made by Mixteco community members living in Ventura, California.

Antonio Arredondo Juarez was born in Villa Guerrero, Jalisco, Mexico and currently studies non-profit business administration at California State University, Channel Islands. For *Campos de Ensueños*, Juarez photographed farm workers and mounted their portraits to waxed produce boxes attached to shipping palettes.

Organizing curator of the exhibition Craig Rosen said, "Campos De Ensueños seeks to shine a light on the work campesinos perform, hoping to instill an appreciation and curiosity in the viewer. The show seeks to raise awareness about the Mixteco people, their struggles and aspirations."
